



Semillon Elkosh Vineyard 2012



The Elkosh Vineyard is close to Moshav Elkosh and descends towards Nahal Matat. The site at 720 meters is bounded by Mount Biranit to the north Fasuta and Mount Tzonam to the west and Mount Matat to the east.

The Elkosh Vineyard was planted in 2009 and this Semillon is from the first harvest of that vineyard. The Semillon is planted on a steep northern slope at an altitude of 720 meters on very chalky soil.

The logo on the label represents an ammonite fossil, as so many were found during the preparation of the vineyard site.

WINEMAKING:

The grapes were harvested on 26 August 2012. The wine was fermented in second use French-oak barrels and then aged for a further four and a half months in the same barrels.

TASTING NOTES:

This wine is rich and creamy, with note of lemon zest and citrus. The wine is long on the finish and shows great finesse. This wine will benefit from moderate cellaring.
